Anna I just wanted to ask you, why has Healthwatch been set up in the first place?

Well I guess one very important reason is because when we all use health and social

At the local level Healthwatch has a very similar arrangement.

So at the local level local Healthwatch will be sat on a thing called The Health and Well-Being

and social care in the area is developed, and they will have a similar role to the commissioners

How can we be sure that you are going to be an independent body, because you get money

So how will that work in terms of being independent from them?

Well I could give you lots of reasons why you should think we are going to be independent.

things should make sure we could be independent,

but what will really make us independent is

And really the only people who can make that judgement will be people like yourself, and

we will have to win your confidence, to earn our stripes if you like by the way we do our

So what will you do if you find something is really wrong?

Well I think the people who are most likely to hear of something that's really wrong

What matters is that whoever they speak to it will go to the right place for something

0:05:28.440,0:05:34.030 to be done about it instantly, and we will do that, as will local Healthwatch.

0:05:37.310,0:05:42.480 Well there'll be 152 local Healthwatchs, and each of them will be commissioned by a

0:05:47.090,0:05:53.870 What our task is is to make sure, together with all 152 of the local Healthwatch groups, combined with Healthwatch

0:06:01.950,0:06:06.940 that they have together, so we get a really strong picture of what's happening to consumers

0:07:03.010,0:07:10.010 And we need to have, at national level, relationships with all those specialist organisations who

0:07:10.090,0:07:15.130 have really good evidence about the issues that affect the users of those particular

0:07:15.130,0:07:20.550 services, or users with particular sets of issues.

0:07:20.550,0:07:25.160 So we need to build that network, as well as having a network with local Healthwatch groups.

0:07:25.160,0:07:32.160 And local Healthwatch themselves also need to have really good relationships with the

0:07:32.530,0:07:38.860 local organisations, such as Age UK, Diabetes UK, and so on, all those user groups that

0:07:38.860,0:07:42.960 we know exist in local communities.

If Healthwatch was a big success what's the one thing that you'd have like to have

0:07:51.830,0:07:54.420 Well I think it's really important it is a big success.
